The National Identified Risk Framework Coordinator has requested that the Insurance Commission of The Bahamas ("the Commission") circulate the following documents regarding The Bahamas' NRA Summary of Key Findings and The Bahamas' National Anti-Money Laundering Risk Strategy 2025-2028.

Licensees are asked to thoroughly review both documents to ensure that their anti-money laundering policies and procedures, as well as their risk mitigation strategies, are fully aligned with the objectives outlined in these documents. Licensees should also ensure that their frameworks address key regulatory expectations, effectively mitigate the identified risks, and support a robust and compliant AML program that upholds industry standards and safeguards against financial crimes.
